In the Name of god Amen

I William Rollings of the county of Flem-  
ing and State of Kentucky being weak in  
body but blest with perfect mind and memory  
yet knowing that it is appointed for all men  
once to die do make and ordain this as my  
last will and testament

Item first I resign my body to death and due  
Christian burial and my soul to god who gave it  
secondly I will that all my lawful debts be paid  
out of my personal estate

thirdly  
I give and bequeath to my son Pamelley  
Rolling one reasonable <sup>portion</sup> bed and bedding to be  
judged by my executors

fourthly I give and bequeath to my son William  
Rollings Daughter Barbary twenty five dollars  
to be raised out of my personal estate

fifthly  
I give and bequeath to my wife Barbary fifty  
dollars of my personal estate to be made up  
to her in such <sup>goods</sup> household as she may choose  
sixthly to my wife Barbary

I give and bequeath all my real estate during  
her natural life time and further I will  
and ordain that after my decease if my  
wife ~~shall~~ sees cause to take either of  
my children to live on and occupy the  
plantation the said he or she shall give  
with approved security for the comfortable  
support and care of her the said Barbary  
to be executed to the executors of this  
my last will and testament

herewith  
I will that after the above donations  
the remainder of my personal estate be  
divided in the following manner one sixth  
part to my son Thomas Rollings one sixth part  
to my Daughter ~~Mary~~ Elizabeth Day one sixth part to  
my son William Rollings one sixth part to my  
son Aaron Rollings one sixth part to my son  
Presley Rollings and one sixth part to my  
Daughter Mary Day and one sixth part  
to my grandson Samuel first son  
of ~~my daughter~~  
Elizabeth

I will that after the death of my wife Barbara  
the same be divided among my heirs  
in the same manner that this will directs  
the personal estate to be divided

~~by my daughter Mary~~  
Presley Rollings the sole Executors of  
this my last will and testament  
declaring this and no other to be my last  
will and testament given under my hand  
and seal this twenty seventh day of  
February in the year of our Lord one  
thousand eight hundred and fourteen  
in the presence of
